

Notation Key

The notation key is organized into four horizontal sections, each representing a different drum part. Each section contains musical notation for eight different techniques, with the technique name written below the notation.

- Snare:** Shows notation for Normal (quarter note), Rimshot (quarter note with an accent mark), Ping (quarter note with a dot), Backstick (quarter note with a downward-pointing stem), Click (quarter note with a downward-pointing stem), Rim (quarter note with an 'x' above the stem), Cymbal (quarter note with an 'x' above the stem), and Shell (quarter note with a downward-pointing stem).
