Subject: Voter Registration Deadline Nears

Dear Northwestern Student,

If your address has changed at all in the past year (including your residence hall room number), you are required to re-register to vote in the upcoming U.S. presidential election. Tuesday, October 5 is the last day for you to register to vote for the November 2 general election.

There are several ways for you register to vote this fall:

- 1) Visit a dining hall, Norris or Tech registration tables (schedule is online www.northwestern.edu/studentaffairs/voter-registration/index.html);
- 2) Obtain a "motor voter" registration card from your Resident Assistant in your residence hall and return it to your RA for collection or mail it directly to the address given;
- 3) Download a registration card from www.voterinfonet.com and mail it directly to the address given.

Students who are U.S. citizens may vote in the U.S. general election in Illinois as long as they have been residents in the state for 30 days prior to the election on November 2. That means all U.S. students are eligible to vote in Evanston. However, if you want to vote absentee in the state that is your home, consult this web site for directions on how to obtain an absentee ballot: www.fec.gov/pages/faqabsentee.htm.

Please watch The Daily Northwestern and the voting web site www.northwestern.edu/studentaffairs/voter-registration/index.html for locations of polling places for November 2. Please exercise your responsibility as a citizen and participate in the election.
