

Study Abroad Year in Review 2022-2023

## **Executive Summary**



#### Post-COVID Recovery

The 2022-23 academic year yielded increased demand for global learning. Since the pandemic, the Global Learning Office (GLO) has experienced growth in the number of undergraduates who study abroad. The 764 students who studied abroad during the 2022-23 academic year, including summer 2023, represent a 5% increase over the 725 who studied abroad in 2018-19. More seniors studied abroad than before COVID, likely due to travel prohibitions in place in their sophomore and junior years. Of the 2022-23 cohort, 79% studied in Europe, reinforcing a national enrollment trend of lower enrollments in non-European countries. The enrollment growth is even more impressive considering the continued suspension of Northwestern's China programs and the discontinuation of Public Health in Mexico.

#### Centering Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion

While we set and strive to reach goals pertaining to DEI, GLO continues our commitment through our hiring practices, welcoming colleagues with diverse professional and life experiences. Following Diversity Abroad's Global Equity and Inclusion assessment in Fall 2021, the GLO DEI Working Group developed GLO's DEI Strategic Plan, with goals such as increasing participation in education abroad among underrepresented students and supporting equity of outcomes for all students, among others. The GLO team continues to collaborate across the Northwestern community. GLO developed and enacted co-curricular programs including the Global Engagement Coalition — a network of internationally engaged student organizations — and the GLObal Co-Lab — an asynchronous online program fostering collaboration and connection among students studying abroad around the world. In 2022-23, programming and events that centered DEI included Black History Month Global Week featuring panel events and speakers in partnership with Multicultural Student Affairs. GLO's Passport Initiative, a need-based initiative to award funding and support during the passport application process, GLO awarded 12 passports in 2022-23.

## **Executive Summary**

#### **Initiatives**

In 2022-23, GLO offered students 136 study abroad programs in 47 countries. GLO worked with the School of Education and Social Policy (SESP), to **introduce an internship in Milan** to complete the SESP practicum. As part of its commitment to expanding access to study abroad for underrepresented students, in Summer 2023, GLO **launched its second short (4-week, 2 unit) program** in partnership with the School of Communication: Florence: Leading a Renaissance Then and Now, focusing on Leadership Studies in Italy. This joins Classics' Athens: Ancient Culture and Modern City as a flexible program for students for whom an entire summer abroad presents opportunity costs.






% of NU Undergraduates Studying Abroad











National Study Abroad Gender Identity 2021–2022\*




Northwestern Undergraduate Gender Identity 2022–2023\*\*
