- (1) An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.**

Northwestern University signed and returned the Certification and Agreement (CFDA 84.425E) ((a)(1) Student Aid Portion) and has used the applicable funds as designated.

- (2) The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.**

Northwestern University has been awarded \$15,884,247 under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

- (3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the initial report and every calendar quarter thereafter).**

As of September 30, 2021, Northwestern University has distributed \$44,246 to students. Additional funds are being distributed in October 2021.

- (4) The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.**

It is estimated that approximately 7,500 Northwestern University students are eligible to receive these funds.

- (5) The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.**

As of September 30, 2021, 94 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant.

- (6) The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.**

The University has allocated the funds to undergraduate students receiving need-based financial aid, and PhD, DMA, and MFA students, in amounts up to \$2,000 per student.

Information has been provided to students regarding eligibility, funds distribution, intended use of the funds, and other related information.
