First destination study six months after graduation

This report represents data from 1651 (80%) members of the Class of 2021. 2052 undergraduate students graduated Fall 2020, Winter 2021, Spring 2021, and Summer 2021, according to the University Registrar.



CLASS OF 2021 EMPLOYMENT


1180 (71%) recent graduates were employed six months after graduation. Industry information was available for 1114 of these graduates.

Starting salary information was available for 435 of the recent graduates who were employed full-time six months after graduation. The average salary overall was \$67,312.

Locations were available for 1012 employed recent graduates. For virtual work, location of the company was prioritized over location of the student/alumni.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES, INTERNSHIPS, RESEARCH, AND DEEP INVOLVEMENT

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

As part of the 2021 Post-Graduation Survey (one source of information for this study), recent graduates were given a list of 21 experiential learning opportunities and asked to check all those in which they had participated as undergraduates. 572 recent graduates responded to this question.

86% reported that they had engaged in one or more experiential learning opportunities.

INTERNSHIPS

71% reported that they had participated in one or more internship experiences.

RESEARCH

57% reported that they had participated in one or more research experiences.

DEEP INVOLVEMENT

92% reported that they had been "deeply" involved in one or more student organizations, clubs, or varsity athletics.
