

Chicago Graduate Student Funding Opportunities

Albert Schweitzer Fellowships: Each Spring, 28 Chicago Area Schweitzer Fellows are selected from applications submitted by students in a diversity of fields, including but not limited to medicine, nursing, dentistry, public health, social work, psychology, pharmacy, physical therapy, law, nutrition, art therapy, dance/movement therapy, and acupuncture. Working in collaboration with an existing local community agency, each Fellow designs and implements a service project that addresses an unmet community health need. Fellowship projects include a minimum of 200 hours of service (including 130 hours conducting a community service project), guidance from mentors, including a Site Mentor at the hosting community agency, an Academic Mentor at the student's academic institution, and Program mentors, Monthly progress reports on the Fellow's project, and a written report at the conclusion of the project. The Fellowship is an opportunity to be part of an interdisciplinary group of students working in underserved communities and in an inter-disciplinary learning collaborative. Fellows are required to attend a weekend orientation, monthly meetings, service days, and the annual celebration event. American Opera Society of Chicago Scholarships: Scholarships for best vocal artist, male voice, female voice, instrumentalists and one award open to all performance areas. Applicants must be citizens of the United States of America, living and studying within 150 miles of Chicago. Applicants must be advanced students of voice, piano, strings, or other solo instruments, with potential for professional careers. An applicant's audition will consist of 10 (ten) minutes of diversified repertoire to be performed from memory. Art Institute of Chicago Kress Interpretive Fellowship: These Interpretive Fellowships are intended as an opportunity for individuals who have completed a degree (BA, MA, or PhD) in art history, art education, studio art, or museum studies, and who are pursuing or contemplating graduate study or professional placement in these or related fields. <https://www.artic.edu/careers/employment-2/fellowships/graduate-fellowships>

Art Institute of Chicago Schiff Foundation Fellowships: Supports the work of Chicago-area students of architectural design and criticism. The fellowships are administered annually by the museum's Department of Architecture and Design and consist of two awards: The Fellowship for Architecture (recent award, \$15,000) and the Fellowship for Critical Architectural Writing (recent award, \$5,000). <https://www.artic.edu/careers/employment-2/fellowships/graduate-fellowships>

Black Metropolis Research Consortium (BMRC) Summer Short-Term Fellowships: Through an international competition, the Black Metropolis Research Consortium offers one-month residential fellowships in the City of Chicago for its Summer Short-term Fellowship Program. Since 2009, the Summer Short-term Fellowship Program has engaged scholars, artists, writers, and public historians to better formulate new historical narratives of the Black experience. The new, original research, music and art developed through this program is significant as it illuminates the national and international importance of Chicago's African American community to the broader history of Black America. Citizens or permanent residents from any country (applicant from countries outside the United States must hold a valid passport and be able to obtain a J-1 visa even if they are currently in the United States). Each Fellowship consists of one-month of support during the summer fellowship period (June through August). The BMRC provides a stipend of \$4000 for each Fellow to be utilized during the summer in the year in which it was awarded. <https://bmrc.lib.uchicago.edu/programs/summer-short-term-fellowship/>

Chicago Artists Coalition Residency: Two residencies. The BOLT residency is a highly competitive, juried, one-year artist studio residency program offering emerging and established artists the opportunity to engage the Chicago arts community and its public in critical dialogue about contemporary art. The HATCH residency is a juried program for emerging and mid-career Chicago visual artists and curators. It offers the opportunity to produce collaborative exhibitions and strives to support an ecology of curatorial and artistic practice. Once selected, we divide HATCH Artist Residents into groups of 4 to work with one Curatorial Resident. Selected artists will participate in a 2-person and group exhibition organized by their HATCH Curatorial Resident. Each Artist Resident receives professional development through dynamic exhibitions, one-on-one studio visits with their curator, public programs, and community building to develop a sustainable creative practice. <https://chicagoartistscoalition.org/residencies>

Chicago Filmmakers and the Chicago Instructional Technology Foundation Grant. On hiatus: The Chicago Digital Media Production Fund (CDMPF) seeks socially progressive video and media projects that are that are compelling, authentic, and impactful. Chicago Herpetological Society (CHS) Herpetological Grants Program: The mission of the Chicago Herpetological Society is education, conservation, and the advancement of herpetology. To further the mission, the CHS provides grants in the following categories: Illinois Herpetology, Graduate Student Research in Herpetology, Conservation, and Captive Management, Husbandry, and Propagation. Chicago Mayor's Office Fellowship Program: The Mayor's Office Fellowship Program is the premier opportunity for bright, motivated, and civic-minded graduate students from all disciplines to apply their coursework to the greatest municipal laboratory in the world: the City of Chicago. Fellows serve the people of Chicago by supporting policy, legislative, data, communications, and public engagement initiatives within city government. By working hand-in-hand with senior staff in the Office of the Mayor and leaders from various departments and sister agencies throughout the City, Fellows deliver recommendations and implement programs that improve the lives of Chicago's 2.7 million residents. Diversifying Higher Education Faculty (DFI) in Illinois Fellowship: The Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) sponsors this graduate funding opportunity which aims to increase the number of minority faculty and staff in Illinois colleges and universities. Selected fellowship recipients will receive financial support ranging from \$10,000-\$15,000 per year for up to four years. A graduate tuition and a partial fee waiver accompany this fellowship for graduate students. All academic disciplines are eligible, however, IBHE prioritizes applicants pursuing degrees in STEM fields. <https://www.ibhe.org/dfi.html>

Field Foundation of Illinois Fellowship: College students pursuing graduate degrees in Chicago may apply for a nine-month academic year fellowship. The program is a supervised field placement at the foundation offering field work and philanthropic experience. Past fellows have applied through their school to gain credit towards their degree. Fellows learn all aspects of the Field Foundation grantmaking process by reviewing grant proposals, conducting site visits, and formulating grant recommendations, and provide written documentation for the Foundation's staff and Board of Directors. Field Museum Armour Graduate Fellowship: Open to any student enrolled in a PhD program who has completed their qualifying exams. Includes an award of \$32,000. <https://www.fieldmuseum.org/about/graduate-student-fellowships>

Field Museum Women in Science Graduate Fellowship: Awards a female graduate student who has completed her qualifying exams. Includes an award of \$32,000. <https://www.fieldmuseum.org/about/graduate-student-fellowships>

Foundations of East Chicago Continuing Education Scholarship: Supports students who already have a degree but are seeking an additional qualification, Master's or Doctoral degree. Applicants must be a resident of the city of East Chicago. This scholarship includes an award of 2,000. Illinois Arts Council Individual Artist Support (IAS): Assists Illinois artists to realize a career goal, take advantage of a professional opportunity, or to produce and present an artistic presentation. The IAS program includes two different tracks. The Artist Project Track supports individual artists in the production and presentation of an artistic project. The Professional Development Track supports professional development opportunities related to an individual artist's career. Illinois Holocaust Museum & Education Center Internships: Internships are available in hospitality, visitor services, collections, education, information technology, grants, and marketing. Fall, Winter, and Spring interns must commit to working at least 20 hours/week for a minimum of 12 weeks during a selected work period. Summer interns who commit to working at least 32 hours/week for a minimum of 8 weeks are preferred. Museum interns receive a stipend for their work. After 4 weeks, interns receive \$1,000, and upon completion of their internship (8 or more weeks), they will receive an additional \$1,000. <https://www.ilholocaustmuseum.org/get-involved/internships/>

Illinois Native Plant Society Research Grant: The Illinois Native Plant Society Research Grant was developed to promote the conservation of Illinois native plants and communities through scientific research. Research grants are available for funds up to \$3000 each. Any person, institution or group conducting research on Illinois native plants can apply. Eligible research projects may include studies on Illinois native plants and communities (including those that are threatened or endangered), such as life history, reproductive biology, demography, genetics, comparative site inventories, community ecology, ecological interactions, and threat impacts. Illinois Physical Therapy Foundation Scholarships: The Illinois Physical Therapy Foundation offers several scholarships including the Leadership Scholarship and the Student to Student Scholarship. <https://iptfgives.org/>.

Illinois Space Grant Consortium (ISGC) Graduate Fellowship: The Illinois Space Grant Consortium (ISGC) will award fellowships to outstanding students pursuing a graduate degree in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) disciplines that support NASA's mission. Includes a \$10,000 dollar fellowship. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen. Applicants must be Full-time student majoring in a STEM area, including, but not limited to: engineering, computer science, the biological and life sciences, chemistry, geological sciences, physics, and astronomy. Illinois State Academy of Science Student Research Grant Awards: Provide up to \$1,000 to graduate student members. These grants are intended to support your research efforts and cannot include funds for salary, standard equipment, tuition, travel to meetings, manuscript preparation, publication costs, or payment of indirect costs such as facilities and administration. If you are a previous award recipient you may apply for a second year of support, but not for a third year.

Museum of Contemporary Photography (MoCP) Snider Prize: A purchase award given to emerging artists in their final year of graduate study. The winner receives \$3,000, and two honorable mentions each receive \$500 towards the purchase of work to be added to the MoCP's permanent collection. <https://www.mocp.org/about/opportunities/the-snider-prize/>

National Association of Teachers of Singing Chicago Chapter Student Auditions: Each year Chicago Chapter NATS hosts Student Auditions in Classical, Musical Theater, Contemporary, and Youth categories. Newberry Library/The American Society for Eighteenth-Century Studies (ASECS) Fellowship: Supporting scholars who wish to study the period between 1660 and 1815 and demonstrate a specific need for the Newberry's collection. Includes a stipend of \$3,000 a month for one month. Applicants must be members of the American Society for Eighteenth-Century Studies. <https://www.newberry.org/research/fellowships/short-term-fellowships>

Newberry Library, Audrey Lumsden-Kouvel Fellowship: Supporting scholarship related to history and literature in the Late Medieval and Early Modern period. Preference will be given to projects focusing on the colonial Americas and Romance cultures, especially translations and topics focusing on Portuguese, Spanish, and Latin American Studies. Includes a stipend of \$5,000 a month for 4-9 months. Newberry Library, Evelyn Dunbar and Ruth Dunbar Davee Fellowship: Supporting scholarship in music related to the Newberry collection. Includes a stipend of \$5,000 a month for 4-9 months. Newberry Library Fellows' Fellowship: Supporting scholars who demonstrate a specific need for the Newberry collection. Includes a stipend of \$3,000 a month for one month. Newberry Library, Frances C. Allen Fellowship: Supporting women of American Indian heritage. Preference for this award is given to non-tenured women working in any graduate or pre-professional field. Scholars working in all fields are welcome to apply. Includes a stipend of \$3,000 a month for one to two months. Newberry Library Herzog August Bibliothek Wolfenbüttel Joint Fellowship: This fellowship adds one additional month of support to a long-term fellowship for research at the Herzog August Bibliothek in Wolfenbüttel, Germany. The proposed project must describe the materials to be consulted at both the Newberry Library and the Herzog August Bibliothek. The recipient should

plan to visit the libraries sequentially to ensure continuity of research. Includes a stipend of 1,800 Euro/month plus 650 Euro for travel expenses. Newberry Library, Lloyd Lewis Fellowships in American History: Supporting scholarship in any area of American history that is relevant to the Newberry's collection. Includes a stipend of \$5,000 a month for 4-9 months. Newberry Library, Mellon Foundation Fellowship: Supporting scholarship in any field relevant to the Newberry's collection. Includes a stipend of \$5,000 a month for 4-9 months. Newberry Library, Midwest Modern Language Association (MMLA) Fellowship: Supporting scholars working on projects in literary and cultural criticism. Newberry Library, Monticello College Foundation Fellowship for Women: Supporting a pre-tenure woman whose work points to a future of scholarly productivity and who would benefit significantly from being in residence at the Newberry. Preference will be given to projects concerned with the study of women. Includes a stipend of \$5,000 a month for 4-9 months. Newberry Library, National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowship: Supporting scholarship in any field relevant to the Newberry's collection. Includes a stipend of \$5,000 a month for 4-9 months. Applicants must be United States citizens or foreign nationals with three continuous years' residence in the US. Newberry Library, Richard H. Brown/William Lloyd Barber Fellowships: Supporting scholarship in any area of American history that is relevant to the Newberry collection. Includes a stipend of \$5,000 a month for 4-9 months. Having a PhD (or equivalent terminal degree) by the application deadline is required. <https://www.newberry.org/research/fellowships/long-term-fellowships>

Newberry Library, Rudolph Ganz Fellowship: The Rudolph Ganz Fellowship supports researchers using the Rudolph Ganz Papers and other late nineteenth- and early twentieth-century materials related to Chicago music in that period. Ganz's papers include musical compositions of the world-renowned concert pianist, composer, conductor, and educator, as well as articles, speeches, lectures and essays by him, and two recordings. Includes a stipend of \$5,000 a month

Society of Tribologists and Lubrication Engineers (STLE) Chicago Section Fellowship: Each year the Chicago section of STLE partners with the STLE national organization to offer scholarships for students interested in pursuing a career in tribology and lubrication. Eligible students include graduate students and students who have completed their 2nd year or greater of undergraduate study. The awards will range from \$500 to \$2,500 per student, with a total of \$10,000 to be given out. Named in honor of the founding editor of *Signs*, the Catharine Stimpson Prize is designed to recognize excellence and innovation in the work of emerging feminist scholars. This program provides up to two years of funding for the highest caliber junior scholars from diverse backgrounds, including historically underrepresented groups, such as Black/African American, American Indian or Alaskan Native, and Hispanic/Latino scholars. Provost's Postdoctoral Fellows will be appointed as Instructors on the tenure track for up to two years with the intent that they will be promoted to Assistant Professor at the end of the fellowship period. <https://provostpostdoc.uchicago.edu/>

University of Illinois Chicago (UIC) Douglas A Garofalo Fellowship: The School of Architecture in the College of Architecture, Design and the Arts, at the University of Illinois at Chicago invites applications for the Douglas A Garofalo fellowship. This provides emerging designers with an opportunity to teach studio and seminar courses in the undergraduate and

graduate programs and conduct independent design research. During its second semester, the fellowship includes a public lecture at the Graham Foundation for Advanced Studies in the Fine Arts and an exhibition, which is typically held at the school. The fellowship lasts for nine months. The selected fellow will be expected to be in primary residence in Chicago from mid-August 2023 through mid-May 2024.
