COLLABORATION HIGHLIGHTS

In August 2023, Northwestern hosted the **2nd Northwestern-Münster Symposium on Smart Materials**, themed “From Nanoscience to Biomedicine.” The event featured an official signing ceremony marking the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Northwestern’s International Institute for Nanotechnology and the University of Münster. Münster Rector Johannes Wessels and Northwestern Provost Kathleen Hagerty led the ceremony, underscoring the strong academic partnership between the institutions.

In Sept 2023, 16 undergraduate students traveled to Germany to explore topics on renewable energy and sustainability. The **Global Engineering Trek to Germany**, spanning nine days, was led by Engineering Professors Matthew Grayson and Seda Ogrenci, and Janka Pieper from the Office of the Vice President for International Relations. In Germany, the trek was hosted by Northwestern partners Universität Hamburg and University of Münster.
