Sexual Misconduct Disclosures: A Guide for Faculty & Staff

1. LISTEN

- CONFIRM the person's safety. If they are not safe, help them create a plan to get to a safe place. Call 911 if needed.
- PROVIDE nonjudgmental support. Avoid questions that suggest blame or show doubt.
- RESPOND with compassion and sensitivity.

2. REFER

- REVIEW reporting options with the person (both the right to file with law enforcement and the right to file a complaint with Northwestern).
- DIRECT the person to on-campus confidential resources.
- □ SHARE off-campus resources.

3. REPORT

- EXPLAIN your obligation to report the information.

If someone discloses an incident of sexual misconduct to you, including sexual assault, stalking, dating or domestic violence, or sexual harassment, please take the following steps:
