## Paper and cardboard

- Office paper
- Cardboard
- Brochures and flyers
- Magazines and catalogs
- Junk mail
- Newspaper
- Envelopes
- Paperback books
- Paper bags
- Drink boxes
- Milk or juice cartons
- Paperboard (e.g. cereal boxes)


## Cans and foil

- Aluminum and steel cans
- Aluminum foil and trays


## Glass

- Glass bottles and jars

- Plastic containers \#1 - \#5 (e.g. bottles, jugs, yogurt cups/tubs, 6-pack rings)



## What goes in trash bins (landfill)?

- Paper cups
- Food wrappers
- Plastic bags and film
- Paper towels, napkins, tissues
- Greasy/dirty cardboard or paper
- \#6 plastic (Styrofoam) $\widehat{\text { ¢ }}$
- \#7 plastic/unlabeled plastic $\widehat{47}$
- Ceramics
- Drinking glasses
- Laminated paper/stickers
