

Clery Act Campus Security Authority Responsibilities - Students

What Is the Clery Act?	As part of the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act, otherwise known as the Clery Act, certain categories of <i>crime</i> , <i>arrest</i> and <i>referrals</i> at certain locations are required to be reported in an Annual Security Report that is published by October 1st each year and is made available to the campus community. The Annual Security Reports are available on the University Police website at http://www.northwestern.edu/up/safety/annual-report/index.html . Another key requirement of the Clery Act is to issue campus alerts to the campus community on crimes considered to be a threat to students and employees that are reported to Campus Security Authorities (CSAs) or local law enforcement agencies. The overall intent of the Act is to encourage the reporting and collection of accurate campus crime data and to promote crime awareness and enhance campus safety.
What Is a Campus Security Authority (CSA)?	The Clery Act identifies certain categories of students, University employees and contractors as Campus Security Authorities (CSAs) who have federally mandated responsibilities to report crimes that are reported to them.
	The intent of including non-law enforcement personnel in the role of CSA is to acknowledge that some community members and students in particular may be hesitant about reporting crime to the police, but may be more inclined to report incidents to other campus-affiliated individuals.
CSA Crime Reporting Obligation	While CSAs are only obligated to report allegations of Clery Act crimes that are reported to them, or that they witness, occurring within the University Clery geography (¹see below), Evanston Student Affairs student employee CSAs are directed to report all non-emergency criminal incidents to their direct supervisor. The Student Affairs Supervisor is responsible for coordinating Clery Act crime reporting / report form submission. Student CSAs who are not Evanston Student Affairs employees should complete and submit a CSA Crime Report form located at: http://www.northwestern.edu/up/safety/crime-report-form.html .
	A Clery Act crime is considered "reported" when it is brought to the attention of a CSA, University Police or local law enforcement personnel by a victim, witness, other third party or even the offender. The crime reporting party need not be University affiliated.
	CSAs are not required to report crimes that they learn of indirectly (e.g., overhear; through inclass discussion; mentioned during a speech, workshop, or group presentation). CSA crime reporting is not a substitute for, nor does it supersede, any existing internal Departmental or other University reporting methods or protocols already in place for reporting incidents.

How a CSA When a crime is reported, the CSA should always first handle emergencies and call 911. Responds When a **Crime Is Reported** 2. If it is not an emergency, the CSA should ask the individual reporting the crime to you if they would like to report the incident to University Police. If they do, then the CSA should contact University Police (847-491-3456) to coordinate reporting. All University employees (including student employees), as well as non-employees with teaching or supervisory authority, are obligated to promptly report sexual misconduct of which they become aware to the University Title IX Coordinator or Deputy Title IX Coordinator, 847-467-5078, unless they have a recognized confidentiality privilege. If the reporting party is a student victim of a sex offense and University Police are not involved, a student victim shall also be encouraged to contact the Center for Awareness Response and Education (CARE, 847-491-2054). The CSA should explain that they are a federally mandated crime reporter and are required to submit a crime report for statistical purposes and that the crime report can be submitted without identifying the crime reporting party and/or victim if the reporting party would like to remain anonymous. As previously noted, Evanston Student Affairs student employee CSAs shall report all crimes to their direct supervisor who shall coordinate reporting of Clery Act qualifying crimes using the designated report form. Student CSAs who are not Evanston Student Affairs employees shall complete and submit the designated report form. 4. If the CSA has firsthand knowledge/confirmation that the reporting party already filed a police report with University Police, then the CSA is not obligated to complete and submit a Campus Security Authority Crime Report Form. However, if the reporting party says they will file a police report with University Police, but the CSA has no firsthand knowledge/confirmation that a police report was filed, then the Evanston Student Affairs student employee CSA must still report the crime to their direct supervisor or, in the case of a Student CSA who is not employed by Evanston Student Affairs, complete and submit a CSA Crime Report form available at http://www.northwestern.edu/up/safety/crime-report-form.html. It is very important that CSAs report crime on a timely basis, because a reported crime may warrant a University Police issued timely warning to the University community.

CSAs should not investigate a crime reported to them or attempt to determine whether in fact a crime took place. Student CSAs should simply report the crime on a timely basis to their direct supervisor.
